Who can witness statutory declarations?

A Commonwealth statutory declaration must be signed in the presence of an authorised witness.

An authorised witness can be someone such as a doctor, teacher, pharmacist or a vet.

There are a number of people who may be able to witness your statutory declaration. A [Commonwealth statutory declaration](#) under the [Statutory Declarations Act 1959](#) will need to

A statutory declaration may be made before a person on the list of authorised witnesses in the [Statutory Declarations Regulations 1993](#):

A person who is currently licensed or registered under a law of a State or Territory to practise in one of the following occupations:

- Chiropractor
- Dentist
- Legal practitioner
- Medical practitioner
- Nurse
- Optometrist
- Patent attorney
- Pharmacist
- Police Officer
- Trade Marks Attorney
- Accountant
- Teacher, employed on a full-time basis
- Justice of the Peace
- Sheriff or Sheriff's Officer
- Member of Parliament
- Veterinary surgeon
- Justice of the Peace
